nursery & pre-school

This week in Nursery and Pre-School, we continued exploring Handa's Surprise and Handa's Hen. The children loved using their senses to explore a range of exotic fruits such as coconuts, pomegranates, pineapples, and passion fruits. They also had great fun making and tasting their own fruit kebabs! Our fruit shop was very popular, with busy shoppers using trolleys, baskets, money, and tills. The children enjoyed creating fruit baskets, making fruits from playdough, and balancing baskets on their heads just like Handa! It's been a wonderfully busy week full of fun, fruits, and imaginative play.









This week in Reception the children have learnt the sounds: b,h,f and l in their phonics lessons. We use the scheme 'Little Wandle' who have some amazing videos online if you would like to become more familiar with the scheme. In Talk for Writing we have been reading 'The Three Little Pigs' and the children have started to recognise the initial sounds of some words. We are so proud of them! In Maths we have learned one more and one less, composition of numbers and they been introduced to some of our core maths resources such as tens frames.





In phonics we have been exploring various different graphemes of phonemes we already know including ue, u and ie. In maths we are continuing with addition and have been exploring number bonds to 10. In science we have been exploring seasonal change and look forward to present the weather next week.

Swallows have enjoyed making their musical instruments which Chaffinch will be making soon.







In Maths this week, Year 2 have been working really hard counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Please continue to practise this at home with your children as it will really help them in their future Maths lessons! In Science, we were fascinated to learn about some weird and wonderful animals, explaining how each animal has special features to help it survive in its habitat. Did you know the 'Hairy frogfish' is camouflaged to look like coral and seaweed in its ocean habitat? They use their wide fins to walk along the seabed and find small creatures to eat! We have also been very busy rehearsing for our Harvest Assembly - we hope you are able to join us to see our performance next Wednesday!

Since our assembly falls on the same day as the Halloween Disco, children are welcome to wear non-uniform.



Jay Class explored Black History Month by learning about the inspiring life and legacy of Muhammad Ali. The students were fascinated by his achievements both inside and outside the boxing ring, and they had thoughtful discussions about courage, determination, and standing up for what's right.

Meanwhile, Kingfisher Class took a journey back in time to the Stone Age, where they learned about cave paintings and how early humans expressed themselves through art. The class worked together to create their very own collaborative cave painting!

We're also wrapping up our Light and Dark topic in science. Students have been learning about different sources of light, how shadows are formed, and what happens in the absence of light. It's been a bright and illuminating few weeks!





As Autumn 1 draws to a close, Year 4 have been busy! We've finished our Maths unit on addition and subtraction and begun exploring the features of a diary entry in English. In Geography, we've been learning about the people who live in the Amazon Rainforest and their fascinating way of life. We're looking forward to an exciting final week of the half term. 

Thank you for helping keep our students healthy, safe, and ready to learn this winter season!


