

## What's Been Happening at School this Week?







This week in Robin Class, we continued exploring Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See? The children loved getting hands-on with colourful sensory materials, learning new texture words like soft, hard, smooth and prickly. We also discovered more about the animals in the story, where they live and the countries they come from. The children had great fun making their own shakers and experimenting with fast, slow, hard and gentle sounds. In phonics, we learned the letter p and spotted initial sounds in words like pig and penguin. Our maths learning focused on comparing lengths and counting the right number of objects to match them. To finish off the week, Fun Friday was a hit as children made yummy bear pizzas, carried out a science experiment, and continued practicing brilliantly for our Christmas performance!





In Reception this week, the children have been creating props for their Nativity Performance. They have wowed us with their creativity! We have also been working hard to learn our lines and sing our performance songs. In Maths, the children have explored the relationship between 2D and 3D shapes and continued with number writing. Keep up all of the hard work at home, it has been brilliant to see the children use their home writing books. 



We are exploring non-fiction writing and we are looking at facts about animals. We have continued to look at shapes and we have been finding them around the class and school. We have finished exploring maps and designing there own perfect playground.

The children have also finished their Ukelele lessons this week, ending this with a brilliant concert to KS1 and parents.

This week we have also been working with magnets in science, carrying out experiences and learning key vocabulary words such as; attract, repel and magnetic field. In Maths this week the children have been really enjoying their topic of multiplication and division, learning their 3's, 4's and next week their 8's









What a busy and exciting week in Year 4! In science, we explored electricity by conducting experiments and creating our own switches using different materials. We also had a fantastic immersive Roman Day, enjoying activities such as art, cooking, interactive storytelling, and role play. The children really threw themselves into the experience and had a brilliant time.


