
Reminder

What's Been Happening at School this Week?





nursery & pre-school

This week in Robin Class, our story was The Colour Monster! The children learned about different emotions and the colours that represent them, using key vocabulary such as happy, sad, scared, angry, and confused. They had lots of fun creating their own monsters with playdough and stickle bricks, and made beautiful bonfire paintings using a variety of materials. Our first Wow Wednesday was very special, with two parents joining us to make poppies and a Wreath together with the children. Fun Friday was a big hit too, with many families taking part in colour experiments, playdough making, and lots more exciting activities.





Reception

The reception children have come back from their half term break refreshed

and ready to learn. Our new topic is' Woodland Wonders' where we will be learning all about seasonality, hibernation and our new Talk for Wtiting story is 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. The children are really enjoying the story! In Phonic this week we have learnt the new sounds digraphs 'ff, ll, ss' and the letter 'j'. We have also introduced our reading carousel as seen at the Little Wandle school of excellence. The reading carousel ensures that the children have daily access to a variety of written media, such as non-fiction, catalogues and newspapers, aswell as being read stories. and groups will be reading daily to an adult. We conducted an experiment in science this week and the children had wonderful predictions and made fantastic observations. Next week in maths', we will be concentrating on the numbers 0-6 and subitising (recognising a number by looking)







This week we have been looking at split diagraphs like a-e, i-e, o-e, and u-e. We had an awesome time at our maths workshop we showed our parents lots of fun things we learn and use in maths to help us develop. We are looking forward to impress you again with our upcoming x-mas show

Welcome back, everyone! We hope you all had a wonderful half term break and enjoyed some time to rest and recharge. It has been lovely to see all the children back, full of energy and ready for another exciting term of learning. In Maths, we have been focusing on addition and subtraction, using different strategies to solve problems and explain our reasoning. In English, we have started our new text Little Red Riding Hood.

The children have enjoyed exploring the story, describing the characters, and beginning to plan their own retellings. In Science, we have launched our new topic on microhabitats and minibeasts. The children have been curious and enthusiastic as we discussed where small creatures live and how their habitats help them survive. As Remembrance Day approaches, we have been learning about its importance and making thoughtful poppy artwork to show respect and remembrance. It has been a fantastic start to the new half term. Well done, Year 2!



It has been lovely welcoming Year 3's back into school this week after a well-deserved week off. They have already been working so hard this week starting new topics in English and Science. In Science we are now learning about forces and magnets. In English we are starting a new book called The Ghanian Goldilocks a modern twist on the original fairytale. So far, the children have researched all about Ghana on their computers and learnt some key vocabulary from our book by playing a fun game.

The children are also very excited about starting to learn our christmas songs ready for our christmas show and have taken home all their lyrics this week.





Year 4 have enjoyed learning about Guy Fawkes and Bonfire Night, discovering why it is celebrated each year. We also created some colourful Bonfire Night artwork! We also explored Remembrance Day and discussed its importance in honouring those who served. After the break, we're back into routines and ready for a brilliant half term!





This week in Year 5, the children have been reflecting on the importance of Remembrance. They designed and coloured beautiful poppies to honor those who have served and sacrificed during times of conflict. Through class discussions and stories, we talked about the bravery and selflessness of the soldiers who fought to protect not only Britain but the whole of Europe, ensuring the freedoms we enjoy today. The children showed great empathy and understanding as they learned why we wear poppies and how remembering the past helps us to value peace in the present and future.





This half term in English, Year 6 have begun reading the book 'The Last Bear' by Hannah Gold. We've enjoyed exploring this heartwarming story about friendship, courage and protecting our planet. The children have enjoyed learning about Bear Island and it has sparked some wonderful conversations about climate change. Well done Year 6!


