






nursery & pre-school



This week in nursery, the children continued exploring the story of The Rainbow Fish. They have been learning about sharing and caring, and it's been lovely to see them putting this into practice with their friends. The children had lots of fun making colourful fish, singing fishy songs, creating fish tanks, counting on fish, and exploring sea life both indoors and outdoors. It's been a week full









This week in Reception, we have continued with the story of 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' through our writing and through creative tasks. We have made role play props and have collaborated on large-scale collage work (we cannot wait for you to see). In Maths, we have been exploring units of measure - we have sorted objects by size and have discussed height (both classes had a lot of fun putting themselves into height order!)

With the weather due to change next week, can you please ensure that your child is provided with a warm, waterproof coat every day.

Next week, we are looking at capacity and patterns. If you have any plastic bottles; boxes; water jugs; watering cans, etc - these would be brilliant to further the children's learning.





This week, Year 1 have been learning about the past in History. The children talked about their favourite memories and special moments. Some children remembered family holidays, others thought about their first day at school or the first time they went swimming.

In English, we are reading Lost and Found by Oliver Jeffers. The children tried hard to write their own stories in the same style and they enjoyed making up new characters. We are very proud of the children's work this week—keep it up!







Year 2 have really enjoyed their Art lessons this week, developing their maps into 3D artwork. The children had fun choosing their own materials to represent different features and layering materials to make a 3D effect. In Maths, Year 2 practised counting in 1s and 10s on a numberline before estimating where different numbers belong on a numberline. In Geography this week we have been locating the North and South Poles and learning about the points on a compass. In English, we have been using adjectives and prepositions to describe a setting from our story.



Year 3 have had a fantastic start to the term with lots of exciting learning across the curriculum! Kingfisher Class celebrated Black History Month by learning all about the inspiring mathematician Katherine Johnson and her incredible work with NASA. Meanwhile, Jay Class have been exploring the Stone Age and created brilliant handprint artwork to reflect life in prehistoric times.

We're now turning our attention to writing, as both classes prepare for their next Big Write on Monday. The children are full of ideas and ready to show off their creativity and progress!



We can't believe it's already Week 5 of Autumn 1! Year 4 have been exploring the rainforest, learning about its layers, animals, and the Amazon. In English, we've been writing vivid setting descriptions, while in PE the children are developing cricket skills. In music, they're making fantastic progress on the recorder. It's been a brilliant start to the term, and we look forward to even more learning ahead!



Our Year 5 scientists have been soaring to new heights, diving into an exciting investigation of air resistance! We explored how the shape and size of an object can affect its descent, and then applied this knowledge to design and build their own working parachutes. The pupils truly shone, demonstrating incredible initiative in selecting and testing materials, remarkable creativity in their canopy shapes, and excellent application of scientific methods as they adjusted their designs based on trial results. It was fantastic to see them use evidence to solve design challenges and successfully engineer the slowest, most successful flight possible!

This week has been another busy one in year 6! We have taken our first round of mock SATs. The children have done themselves proud and completed these with diligence and strived for their very best. I am an extremely proud of all of the children. The results for these will be sent home soon.

The highlight of the afternoons this week was a Science lesson about invertebrates. The children looked at insects from our school grounds and then used air dry clay to create a detailed model of an invertebrate!










Reminder •
