Robin Class has had a very busy and exciting week! We celebrated Diwali and had a Halloween disco. The children joined in a special assembly about Diwali and enjoyed dressing up in different costumes for the disco. In class, they role-played, twirled, and even had a little fashion show in their costumes. Our story this week was "Dear Zoo". The children wrote letters to the zoo asking for a nice pet, pretended to be different animals, and explored the story through sensory activities. Outside, the children had lots of fun splashing in puddles, experimenting with floating and sinking using leaves and stones, and playing with ducks and boats in the water.







This week in Reception, we have been looking at 2D shapes and the properties of these. The children have begun to demonstrate their understanding by describing them and creating patterns out of them. We have also discussed the celebration of Diwali and have created decorations and diva lamps out of clay. For Halloween, the children have completed observational paintings of pumpkins and discussed how they decay. The teachers have been assessing phonics and we are so impressed with how hard the children have been working on their reading! Keep up the reading at home, we are so proud.






Year 1 have been working really hard in Maths this week, practising adding numbers together and showing great progress with their number facts! Everyone has been super enthusiastic and confident when solving problems. We also had lots of fun at the Halloween Disco — there were some amazing costumes and plenty of dancing! Year 3 have had a lovely last week before breaking up for the half term. The children have been working really hard learning column addition and subtraction this week and learning how to cross over the tens and hundreds. The Year 3 children have got a well-deserved break before getting creative and coming back to school next half term to make volcanoes, vegetable tarts and rehearsing for our ukelele and Christmas shows!

Year 4 have had an excellent final week of the half term. In math's we have been exploring Area, recalling previous learning and understanding how to find the area of rectilinear shapes. In Science we finished our food and digestion topic with a lesson all about poo!

The children used poo clues to find out about and identify different animals!

In Year 5, we have been learning all about the traditions and history of Halloween. We explored how the celebration has changed over time and discussed the different symbols and customs associated with it around the world. Using what we learned, each student designed their own Halloween-inspired artwork, experimenting with a range of artistic mediums such as paint, collage, pastels, and mixed materials. The children carefully planned and sketched their ideas before bringing their final designs to life, showcasing their creativity and individuality. The finished pieces are wonderfully imaginative and capture the spooky spirit of Halloween perfectly!
