nursery & pre-school



Nursery is becoming busier each day as we welcome new children, and it has been wonderful to see how quickly everyone has settled in. This week we have been exploring The Rainbow Fish, sparking lots of excitement about the colourful scales and the story's message of sharing and caring. The children enjoyed creating their own fish through art and playdough, counting and sorting fish, practising writing their names, and even going "fishing in the sea" in small-world play. Both indoors and outdoors, they have joined in with great enthusiasm and had so much fun learning together.



Reception



Reception classes have been busy this week. We have continued our phonics lessons and we have learnt the sounds 'i,n,m and d'. We have begun our Talk for Writing lessons where we have been reading the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears and we have been working on our story maps!! We have also been sorting in our maths' lessons and we have learnt how to sort by colour, type and category...well done reception classes.

The children are doing such a wonderful job and the team here in reception are all very very proud of how far they have come in such a short time.





This week in Geography, Year 1 have explored their classrooms and created their own maps, carefully adding key features and learning how to represent spaces from a bird's-eye view. They loved spotting familiar objects and thinking about where everything belongs. In Art, Year 1 the children have been exploring shapes by experimenting with different types of lines. From straight and zig-zag to wavy and curly, the children discovered how lines can be combined to create interesting shapes and patterns. Their creativity really shone through, and they enjoyed turning simple lines into imaginative designs.


It's been a fantastic week of learning through exploration and creativity!

Reminder: This week's homework is set in their homework books, they will have one page of English and one page of Maths work.






This week in Year 4 the children have been busy exploring and creating. In science they investigated different types of human teeth and made clay models of adult teeth, learning about how they work. In history we looked at the British Roman timeline and discovered how life changed during Roman times. In French we have started our animals topic. Ask your child which animals they can name in French and see what they have learned.

In year 6 this week, we have started a new book in English called "Can we save the tiger?"


This book allows us to explore a non-fiction text about endangered species. We have discussed why animals are becoming endangered and what could lead to them becoming extinct.

In History, we looked at a cencus from 1841. We discussed what life was like for Victorian children at the time. Some of them worked in factories from the age of 10 to help support their families. We couldn't imagine having to go to work - suddenly school seems much more attractive!

Next week, we are going to be supporting the children through a round of mock SATs. This is earlier than planned but we want the children to become a customed to the question types to allow for more support.
