

This week in Robin class, we are continuing with our story 'Owl Babies'. The children have been developing their pencil control by drawing owls and learning about the different emotions the owls feel in the story. We have also been exploring where owls live, making nests, and collecting sticks and other natural materials during a "trail hunt." In maths, the children are learning to count and recognise numbers 0–5. Our new children are settling in beautifully, forming friendships, and enjoying all of the exciting opportunities in their new environment.











Reception




In Reception this week, we have begun learning phase 2 phonic sounds. The children have impressed us with their enthusiasm for writing in their practice books and during their learning play time. Sparrow class had a fantastic music lesson with Mrs Lawson - they learned new songs and began to explore rhythm through movement. (Sparrow class have music lessons up until Christmas; Wren class begin theirs after Christmas.) We have also had a wonderful time exploring different sensory materials like colourful rice and ooblek.





The Year 1 Reading Breakfast was a great success, with many families joining us to share in a morning of reading and togetherness. The children thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to read alongside their parents while enjoying breakfast. It was a pleasure to see such enthusiasm for reading and to celebrate the important role that families play in supporting a lifelong love of books. Thank you to all who attended.




Year 2 are settling back into school really well! In Art this week, the children have been thinking about their journeys to school, mapping out their routes and the important things they see along the way. We're going to look at creating 3D maps next! In Science, Year 2 have enjoyed participating in groupwork, presenting information about the key life processes of both plants and animals to the rest of their class.

In Geography, we have been learning about the 7 Continents of the World. We learnt a new song to help us remember them and we identified them in atlases and recorded this on a map. We are also starting to sing Harvest songs ready for our assembly.



Year 3 have started their cricket sessions this week, they practiced their catching stances and how well they can catch. Year 3 have also completed their first Big Writes this week all about writing a diary entry. They have put a lot of hard work into these. Well done to Year 3!





Year 4 have had a very busy and exciting week of learning! In maths, we have been representing numbers to 10,000 and practising how to partition them in different ways. The children have enjoyed using resources and visual models to show their understanding. In science, we started exploring teeth and their functions, learning about the different types and why they are important for keeping us healthy. We hope everyone has a restful weekend and enjoys the Autumnal weather!

Year 5

This term, our students have been diving into the thrilling novel Room 13 by Robert Swindells. The story is not only capturing their imaginations but also inspiring them to develop their own creative and descriptive writing skills. With its suspenseful atmosphere and mysterious setting, the book fits perfectly with the autumnal season, bringing just the right amount of spooky excitement to our classrooms. Students have been using the text to explore powerful vocabulary, build tension in their own writing, and create vivid imagery that brings their ideas to life.





In year 6 this week, we have continued our hard work. All of the children are participating well and trying their very best.

In our reading comprehension session, the children were introduced to a new book called "Cogheart." This is a story set in Victoria Britain written by Peter Bunzl. The children were excited about the story line to this book and thought about what animal they would like to have as a mechanical servant.

In Science we continued our learning about classification and made our own branching diagrams. These diagrams helped us classify coldblooded vertebrates.

They loved playing with vehicles, dressing up dollies, blowing bubbles, and exploring shapes. Snack time was healthy and delicious with a mix of fruits and vegetables, followed by milk and water. 
St Christophers Academy has community as an important part of our strapline: a community of ambition. We very much value the contribution of parents and carers to improving processes and practice, and driving school improvement.
