Dear Families,

This term is one of our many favourite times of the school year. To see the children arriving in their summer uniforms and making use of the field is a real treat and a sign that summer is officially on its way. #### Safeguarding

The result of our recent safeguarding audit was extremely positive, the audit showed that St Christophers demonstrates a rigorous culture of safeguarding. This was an intense audit looking at every area within the school and we are delighted (but not surprised) by the result. With that in mind, please ensure that at drop off and collection you keep your child close with you, they are often tempted to play on the equipment or run off with their friends but this is not permitted and we ask for your support in helping us keep them safe. Please ensure;

- No dogs on school grounds
- Your child stays with you
- Bikes/Scooters are not ridden until out of the school gates
- Play equipment/ climbing frames including the astro/goals are not used
- You leave swiftly after collection to enable us to secure the site.



#### **Online Safety**

How much do you really know about the sites and apps your children use? It can be extremely confusing and with the constant changing world of social media it can be difficult to keep up! The website <u>https://www.purevpn.com/blog/dangerous-social-media-apps</u> provides information on the popular sites that children should not use. They have

an age restriction of 18 but are often downloaded by much younger. If you have any concerns regarding social media and online safety please feel free to contact our family worker, Mrs. Lay or speak with your child's teacher.

# Free School Meals

If your child is in Reception/KS1 then you are entitled to Universal Infant Free School meals. If your child is in the Nursery/KS2, you may still be entitled to Free School Meals so please contact us or your local authority to find out if you are eligible.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

# <u>Uniform</u>

Summer uniform can now be worn (red and white gingham dress or grey shorts with white school polo shirt.

To help with this the uniform expectations are listed below:

#### The PE/Games kit should remain in school for the duration of the half term.

Hair designs must be appropriate for a school setting. Hair ornaments should be simple and in school colours. We do not permit extreme hair styles such as 'Mohican' styled, dyed, or shaved with patterns or lines in. No oversized hair accessories such as Jo-Jo Bows or other variations of these are permitted.

Jewellery, other than a wristwatch and plain stud earrings (no glass cut or diamante), is not allowed. All jewellery, including earrings, must be removed or taped for Physical Education lessons. Hoop earrings and large studs can be very dangerous and are unsuitable for school, as are necklaces, rings and bracelets. No jewellery other than that of religious significance and should be worn on the inside of the academy uniform.

# School Governors
